Al+Africa Lead Natural Language Processing Community of Practice (NLP-CoP)

Overview

<u>The MERL Tech Initiative (MTI)</u> is looking for a part-time (60%) **AI+Africa Lead** for our <u>Natural Language</u> Processing Community of Practice (NLP-CoP).

The NLP-CoP is a global, transdisciplinary community of 1200+ members that is exploring, learning, and collaborating on the safe and responsible use of artificial intelligence (AI) for monitoring, evaluation, research and learning (MERL). Our work bridges the areas of evaluation, ethical production and use of data and evidence, participatory data governance, and responsible use of data and emerging technologies to improve social impact. A key goal is democratizing understanding of emerging AI and strengthening capacities among MERL professionals to responsibly and ethically use emerging AI tools to enhance their practice.

The Al+Africa Working Group, one of the NLP-CoP's 8 sub-working groups, is exploring NLP and emerging Al in African contexts. (Some 25% of the NLP-CoP's members hail from and/or work on the African continent.) The Al+Africa Working Group has expressed interest in building relationships and connections across the continent, with an eye toward sharing learning and improving cross-sector, cross-disciplinary collaboration on the use of Al for MERL and the application of MERL to Al and its impact on policy and society.

The Al+Africa Lead will focus on supporting the Al+Africa Working Group to create space, structure and momentum for its members to work, learn together and connect with each other and with other networks working on different aspects of Al development and governance in Africa. The work will also support the Al+Africa Working Group to strengthen its capacities to better use data and Al to improve MERL and evidence-based policy making. The Al+Africa Lead will also play a role in landscaping, understanding, networking and connecting at the intersection of MERL+Al in Africa more broadly.

- Passionate about training, learning and supporting transdisciplinary communities to grow their knowledge, collaborate, and apply learning to their practical and strategic work
- Ready for an opportunity to build your professional network within a nimble, high-impact, motivated team of other consultants who are driving forward the field of ethical, responsible use of Al in international development, humanitarian and human rights-related work and the use of Al for MERL.

Description of the job

The main activities for this part-time role include:

Research, Landscaping, Planning, Trendspotting

- Conduct a participatory research and landscaping exercise to better understand current Al+MERL efforts, existing similar or related efforts, and existing communities of practice on the continent, and opportunities for collaboration
- Develop a plan for next steps and actions together with the Al+Africa Working Group based on the landscaping
- Regularly scan newsletters, social media, mainstream media, and other sources to stay abreast of developments related to Al+MERL in African contexts
- Stay on top of emerging trends, challenges, tools and topics related to AI+MERL in Africa

Ongoing support for the Al+Africa Working Group

- Work with Al+Africa Working Group members to implement plans for learning and collaborating
- Identify topics and speakers; plan and organize virtual and in-person events on MERL+AI based on Working Group interests
- Write and/or work with Al+Africa Working Group Members to write blog posts and thought pieces and Working Group meeting summaries
- Share relevant articles, links, events with the Working Group
- Establish metrics and process for monitoring and improving the Al+Africa Working Group together with the overall NLP-CoP
- Manage Working Group membership, membership list, and Slack channel
- Seek feedback from the Working Group for continual improvement





Training and capacity strengthening

- Identify and share relevant external events and opportunities on AI+MERL in Africa
- Organize and design internal training, capacity strengthening, and learning events and opportunities based on needs and interests as expressed by AI+Africa Working Group Members
- Identify suitable organizations and individuals to support learning and training on AI+MERL

Support wider NLP-CoP and MTI activities

- Engage with other networks and communities of practice to cross-pollinate learning around AI+MERL in Africa
- Develop concept notes to seek support for training and other Working Group activities
- Support strategic growth and development of the overall NLP-CoP, with an eye to ensuring representation, participation, and influence of the Al+Africa Working Group in wider CoP efforts
- Collaborate with other MTI team members and the overall NLP-CoP Community Manager

Hours, location, compensation, terms

- Part-time position (60% time 3 days per week / 12 days per month)
- Salary range of \$45-50k USD depending on experience
- May require occasional after-5pm meetings to overlap with team members in US and Europe
- Remote role candidates must have own laptop/computer and a steady Internet connection
- 1 month trial period as part of a 2025 contract, with potential to renew for up to 18 months total
